Biographical sketch:	
<p>John Rankin was born on January 30, 1834 near Glasgow, Scotland. In 1849 he became an apprentice with W. and G. Miller, Dry Goods in Glasgow. He sailed for New York in 1855 and settled first in London, then in Dundas in 1856. He eventually became the manager of the Dundas Woollen Mill for G.M. Barton. A job offer in Scotland saw him return there briefly in 1858, but he returned to Dundas via Montreal in 1859. He met his wife Janet Ann Ball in 1862 and they were married in 1864. He borrowed money in 1866 to open his own store, John Rankin Clothing and Dry Goods Store, but was nearly bankrupted in 1876. In 1877 Rankin built a home on Sydenham Street and that enterprise proved costly. He sold his store in 1879, clerked in Sarnia in 1880, and became manager of a friend's store in Wyoming, Ontario. John Rankin died there suddenly on March 20, 1881 after a fall on an icy sidewalk, leaving his wife and four surviving children.</p>	
Scope and content:	
<p>The fonds consists mainly of the diaries and letter books of John Rankin, encompassing the years 1850 to 1861 which describe his life and work in Scotland and Canada. The fonds includes detailed personal expense and account books, a Sabbath School roll book, ephemera. The fonds also contains books and booklets, most published before Rankin's birth.</p>	
Custodial history:	
<p>The material in the John Rankin fonds was donated to the Dundas Historical Society in 1947 by Rankin's daughter, Catherine Rankin. Some material was received under Accession 1947-10.</p>	
Physical Description Note:	
<p>The fonds includes some dried flowers interleaved among pages on which are printed scenic locations in Scotland.</p>	
Language:	English
Restrictions on access:	There are no restrictions on access. Due to the age and condition of some of the material, access may be supervised or limited.
Associated materials:	
<p>Accruals are not expected, but may occur.</p>
